ethics review framework is poised to adopt international bestpractice and change. 03




Irish health research regulatory landscape





National Office journey







Informed consent → communication, privacy & protection




Respect, dignity, well-being dignity \rightarrow participant-centered approach, assisted decision-making

 Instil international best practice - engagement with international experts, bioethics councils, EU counterparts, EMA working groups


